

## Examination fee

The examination fee set by the Chartered Institute of Linguists for 2019 was £680 and the fee for 2020 is likely to be in the same region. The exact fee will be confirmed by the CloL. Enrolment cards will be distributed during the December sessions to all candidates. You should either:

- » Complete and return the card to us by the date specified by your Course Tutor, together with your payment in full. Cheques should be made payable to 'Institute of Linguists Educational Trust'.

or

- » Complete and return the card directly to the Chartered Institute of Linguists no later than the 8th March 2020.

We cannot accept responsibility for any late enrolment in this or any session.

### Please Note:

By enrolling in the course you are not committed to sit the exam. In other words, you can undertake any of the courses starting in October and sit the examination, for example, in the following June or in the following year. Please note that for certain "rare" languages the Chartered Institute of Linguists may only offer examinations in alternate years.

It is up to you, as the candidate, to verify that your language is in the Chartered Institute of Linguists list of languages offered for your intended examination diet. The exam is divided into several units. You do not need to sit all units in your first attempt. If you choose to sit only some of the units, you will only need to pay for the units you are sitting.

## Note regarding course content and fluency:

It is expected that you will have complete fluency in your language (both written and spoken) as well as in English. This course is NOT a language course nor is it simply a basic course in 'how to become an interpreter'. This course will cover the Scottish Legal system or Health system, interpreting, translation and sight translation techniques, good practice relating to these in the correct context and opportunity to practice for your exam.

## Cancellation

In the event of a cancellation by the applicant/student, a minimum administration fee of £50 will be charged. In addition to this, the following cancellation fees apply:

- » Cancellation between the course start date and 31st December 2019: £150 cancellation fee
- » Cancellation after 1st January 2020: No refund will be due

Cancellation terms are applicable from the date of registration.

Please note that the cancellation fee applies from when you inform Global Language Services Ltd of your intention to cancel **regardless** of your **attendance at classes**.

Should, for any reason, the student not undertake the exam, refund of course fees will not be available. In addition to this, should the Chartered Institute of Linguists change the student's preferred examination centre, or state that the language is not available, then a refund is not available.

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## What is the Diploma in Public Service Interpreting DPSI

The DPSI (Diploma in Public Service Interpreting) is the professional qualification offered by the Chartered Institute of Linguists for interpreters working in the public sector in the UK. Most public sector organisations are now insisting that interpreters have this qualification, including the Scottish Courts Service, Crown Office and Procurator Fiscal Service, Scottish Children's Reporter Administration, NHS, most Councils, the Ministry of Justice and Police Scotland.

The DPSI is currently the only widely recognised qualification for bilingual speakers wanting to work in these settings and represents the easiest route to become a 'qualified interpreter' in the UK.



## Course Structure

**Evening courses** normally run on Tuesday evenings for the Law option and Wednesday evenings for the Health option. Additional evening courses might be scheduled on a different weekday if there is sufficient demand. There will be a total of 30 sessions (6pm to 9pm)

**Weekend courses** will take place over several weekends for a period of seven months. There will be 10 full day sessions (10am to 4pm) in total, with a timetable being made available nearer to the start date.

## Fees and Payment schedule

The current tuition fee for all the above courses is subsidised and, as such, it is set at £350.

Students can pay for the course in full upon registration or by instalments\* as follows:

- » £136 upon registration
- » £114 to be received by 30th November 2019
- » £114 to be received by the 31st January 2020 (to avoid examination fee deadline).

*\*Please note that payments by instalments are subject to a 4% surcharge*

Cheques should be made payable to 'Global Language Services Ltd'. Interpreters working regularly for Global Language Services Ltd can request in writing to have tuition fees deducted from their salary if earnings permit.

**Such requests will be considered on a case by case basis at the company's discretion.**

Please note that a place on the course will not be reserved until the first instalment is paid.

**In the event of non payment of fees, students may be removed from the course.**

## Early Bird Registration

The Early Bird Fee is £300 and the deadline for this offer is the 15th September 2020.

In order to take advantage of the Early Bird Fee, you will need to register and submit your payment or first instalment (if paying by instalments) by this date.

## Examination

Candidates will have to travel to Glasgow and/or Edinburgh for their DPSI exam. The examination will take place in June 2020. Note that in the case of rare languages, or where there are limited candidates for particular languages, then you may be asked by the CIOL to travel to London or another centre in order to take the exam. This is beyond the control of Global Language Services Ltd as the examination timetable is created by the Chartered Institute of Linguists. If you miss this course and examination diet, the next available examination diet would be the following year as the exam only takes place once a year (with a re-sit for written units in November).
