

Examination:

The exam takes place once a year in January and the enrolment deadline is the end of August of the preceding year.

Candidates will have to travel to Glasgow and/or Edinburgh for their CIOL exam. The examination will take place in January 2019. Word processing facilities for the exam are available subject to the payment of an additional fee. Please note spaces are limited and you are advised to enquire early if you require word processing for your examination.

The DipTrans exam is made up of three units:

- » Unit 01 - Written translation of a general text
- » Unit 02 - Written translation of a semi-specialised text in one of the following: Technology / Business / Literature
- » Unit 03 - Written translation of a semi-specialised text in one of the following: Science / Social science / Law

Examination fee:

The examination fee set by the Chartered Institute of Linguists for 2019 is £616. **The fee must be paid by August if you want to sit the exam in January 2019.** We cannot accept responsibility for any late enrolment in this or any session.

Please Note: By enrolling in the course you are not committed to sit the exam if you do not feel prepared.

Note regarding course content and fluency:

It is expected that you will have complete fluency in your language (**both written and spoken**) as well as in English. **This course is NOT a language course.**

Cancellation:

In the event of cancellation by the applicant/student, a minimum administration fee of £50 will be charged to the student. The following charges apply:

- » Cancellation before the course start date: £50 administration fee.
- » Cancellation after the start date, but before the first tutor assignment is marked (as long as the materials are returned in unused conditions): £100.
- » Cancellation after any assignments are marked: no fee returned.

If, for any reason, the student does not sit the exam, a refund of course fees will not be available.

What is the Diploma in Translation (DipTrans):

The DipTrans is an Ofqual-accredited, internationally recognised qualification offered by the Chartered Institute of Linguists. It offers a professional route into the translation industry for individuals who may not want to take the academic route.

In addition to being more affordable and usually quicker to complete than a Master in Translation Studies, the DipTrans is also generally held in high regard in the translation industry, whereas not all Master programmes are always recognised. Translation agencies can give preference to applicants with the DipTrans over many Master programmes.

The Diploma in Translation also allows you to:

- » Use the title DipTrans after your name
- » Apply for membership of the Chartered Institute of Linguists

Benefits:

DipTrans qualified translators may benefit from a variety of rewards, including:

- » The IoLET Level 7 (Ofqual) Diploma Translation is recognised by the Open University; you may be eligible for transfer of 60 credits at OU level 2.
- » Entry into the translation industry as a freelance translator.
- » Additional recognition for professional translators already working in the translation industry.
- » Advantage when applying for Project Management positions within the translation industry.
- » Career enhancement for many multinationals in the private sector.
- » Eligibility for membership of the Chartered Institute of Linguists.
- » Opportunity to apply for membership of the Institute of Translation and Interpreting.

Funding:

- » ILA200 funding is currently NOT available towards the course fees, but we are hoping it may be in the future.

Fees and Payment schedule:

The current tuition fee is as follows:

Course fee – single payment	£230	£430

* Payment by instalments (subject to a 4% surcharge):

- » £207 upon registration
- » £120 to be received within two months of starting the course
- » £120 to be received within three months of starting the course

Add-on courses:

Add-on courses are optional courses for students who have taken the standard/enhanced course, but still wish to get additional tutor support before sitting the examination.

You will need to complete either the standard or enhanced course before sitting an add-on course.
